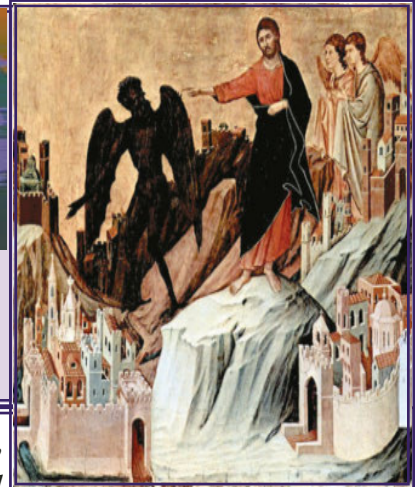

1ST SUNDAY OF LENT

“Him alone shall you serve.”
- Lk 4:8

Sunday's Readings: Deuteronomy 26:4-10; Ps 91:1-2, 10-11, 12-13, 14-15 (see 56); Romans 10:8-13; Luke 4:1-13



Gospel Reflection :One of the most fascinating moments in American history is when George Washington could have become the king of the newly liberated United States and didn't. At the height of his power and fame, on Dec. 23, 1783, he resigned his commission as Commander-in-Chief, and went home. The astonished King of England remarked that in doing so, Washington was “the greatest man in the world.” Greatness is often defined by what we could do but don't. Greatness is measured by the temptations we overcome.

Jesus' greatness is revealed in his victory over temptations, too. The three offered him by the devil contain, we might say, all potential possible temptations: food, power and fame. They correspond to the triple human needs of body, soul and spirit. In overcoming these three, he says “no” in essence to every and even the greatest temptation. We see that every desire of his humanity — body, soul and spirit — is perfectly united to God, to love. This is a power available to each member of his body. It is the path to true greatness. How can we, who so easily fall into even small temptations, find the power to overcome large ones? By entering into the great dynamics of Jesus' temptations.

Lenten challenge: This first week of Lent, list some concrete ways you can overcome temptations that correspond with your desires. For example, you may give up snacks between meals, choose not to participate in an activity of which you are an expert, and decide to reduce social media posting by 50%. It may not seem like much, but by saying “no” to the tyranny of food, power, and fame (in this example), you'll discover true greatness.

Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that began on Ash Wednesday. Fasting and abstinence during Lent are practices that can help us focus on God, repent, and prepare for Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully.

- **Fasting and abstinence can help us remember that we are fed, nourished, and sustained by God's love.**
- **Fasting and abstinence can help us prepare for Easter, when we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ.**
- **Fasting and abstinence can help us unite ourselves with the sacrifice of Jesus.**

Many know of the tradition of abstaining from meat on Fridays during Lent, but we are also called to practice self-discipline and fast in other ways throughout the season. Fasting & abstinence is for adults between the ages of 18 and 59. Abstinence (not eating meat) is required starting at age 14. At age 18 fasting is required as well. Exceptions are medical/poor health and those whose work necessitates 3 full meals.

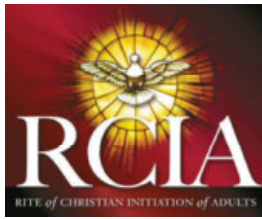

RCIA - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults



On the **First Sunday of Lent**, those who have been accepted as candidates for Easter Baptism are now called the **“Elect”**.

On the **Second Sunday of Lent**, they are anointed with the **Oil of Catechumens, one of the oils blessed by the Bishop at the Chrism Mass.**

On the **Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent**, parishes celebrate the **“scrutinies”** of the Elect. The Elect come before God and scrutinize their lives in light of the Gospel. The Elect are prayed for that **“they may reject everything in their lives that is contrary to Christ.”**

Everyone in the assembly is called to think about their own life. The prayers for the elect become everyone’s prayer. When we join in these prayers we participate in the preparation for the celebration of the paschal mystery (Jesus’ life, death and resurrection). The scrutinies are rites for soul searching and repentance for the whole community.

1^{er} Domingo de Cuaresma

Preparados o no preparados, la Cuaresma ha llegado a nuestra vida. Y, el Papa Francisco nos invita a reflexionar en lo siguiente: *“Al comienzo de la Cuaresma nos hará bien a todos nosotros pedir la gracia de conservar la memoria de todo lo que el Señor ha hecho en mi vida: cómo me ha querido, cómo me ha amado. He aquí, pues, el significado de las expresiones: Mira hacia atrás - ¡que no es lo mismo que vuelve hacia atrás – el camino que has hecho. Y el bienestar, incluso espiritual, conlleva el peligro de caer en una cierta amnesia. Es precisamente en este momento cuando el corazón comienza a retroceder, porque no escucha la voz de su propio corazón: la memoria”*.

La Iglesia también nos ayuda a llevar este tiempo Santo de Cuaresma invitándonos a la penitencia, a la purificación y de compartir lo que tenemos y somos con los necesitados. Es por eso que el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo son días de ayuno y abstinencia. Los viernes de Cuaresma son días de abstinencia. Todos los viernes de Cuaresma, como todos los viernes del año, somos invitados a practicar nuestra fe con actos de penitencia. Tan sencillos como visitar algún enfermo, ayudarnos en familia, hacer oración y asistir a actos de piedad a la Iglesia local. (Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, numeral 1438). Y lo principal, acercarnos a la Eucaristía dominical para refugiarnos en la Palabra de Dios, que es lo que nos da vida y nos hará llegar a la Pascua resucitados.

La Cuaresma es una temporada de 40 días de oración, ayuno y limosna que **comienza el Miércoles de Ceniza y termina al atardecer del Jueves Santo**. Es un período de preparación para celebrar la Resurrección del Señor en Pascua. Durante la Cuaresma, buscamos al Señor en oración leyendo la Sagrada Escritura. El ayuno y la abstinencia son para adultos entre 18 y 59 años. La abstinencia (no comer carne) es obligatoria a partir de los 14 años. A los 18 años también se requiere el ayuno. Las excepciones son las personas con mala salud y aquellos cuyo trabajo requiere 3 comidas completas. **Porfavor, No traiga flores a la Iglesia durante la temporada de Cuaresma**

CHÚA NHẬT I

Lc 4:1-13

SỐNG NHƯ CON CÁI THIÊN CHÚA

Suy niệm: Trong cuốn tiểu thuyết “Thuyền Trưởng Tuổi Mười Lăm” của Jules Verne có kể chuyện một tên buôn nô lệ giả dạng làm đầu bếp trên tàu, mỗi buổi sáng dùng cục nam châm làm lệch chiếc kim của la bàn trên tàu một chút xíu. Bằng cách ấy, y đã lừa được cậu thuyền trưởng bắt đấng dĩ mười lăm tuổi lái tàu lạc hướng lọt vào sào huyệt của bọn buôn nô lệ. Đó cũng là chiến thuật của ma quỷ dưới tên gọi “tên cám dỗ”. Y không thuyết phục Chúa Giê-su hành động phản lại Chúa Cha, mà chỉ dụ dỗ Ngài vận dụng chính tư cách “Con Thiên Chúa” để làm những việc không phải là ý định, chương trình của Cha Ngài. Trái lại, Chúa Giê-su luôn kiên định lập trường: là Con Thiên Chúa, lẽ sống của Ngài là thực hiện ý muốn của Chúa Cha.

Mời Ban: Khi cám dỗ chúng ta, ma quỷ cũng không dùng chiến thuật nào khác. Nó không bắt đầu cám dỗ chúng ta phạm ngay một tội trọng nhưng dụ dỗ chúng ta làm những việc tốt nhưng chỉ vì ý riêng (để thoả mãn lòng háo danh, tự ái...), hoặc chỉ thoả hiệp một chút dục vọng thầm kín, và tự trấn an bằng cách biện hộ rằng mình cũng chưa đến nỗi phạm tội trọng..., để rồi một ngày bừng con mắt dậy thấy mình đã lún sâu trong tội lỗi tự bao giờ!

Sống Lời Chúa: Học nơi Chúa Giê-su chống lại tên cám dỗ: luôn trung kiên tìm kiếm và thi hành ý Chúa; chống lại cám dỗ ngay từ đầu, không du di, không khoan nhượng.

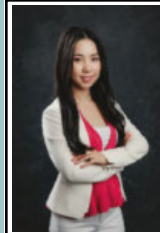

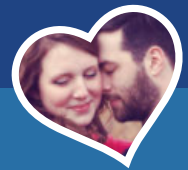
