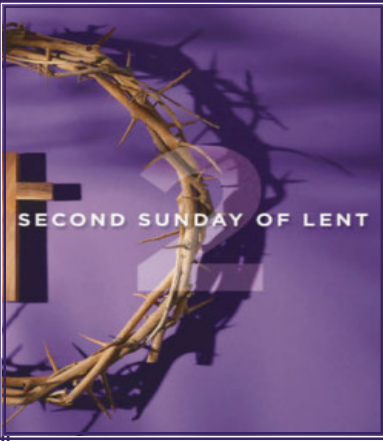

The Resurrection and Spiritual Hangriness

I want to talk about being hangry. I'll give you a quick description of hangriness, though I warn you, it doesn't come from the Oxford English Dictionary. Hangriness is when you're so hungry you get angry. You turn into a real piece of work. You can't get anything done and you're probably not a joy to be around, at least until you grab a snack. Everybody gets this way sometimes. We can be this way in our souls, too. It's so easy to get distracted by the hungers of this world: greed, pride, anxiety. We can become ruled by the needs of our bodies and the desires of our mind and, in doing so, neglect the needs and the desires of our souls.

Everyday stewardship calls us to a constant reflection on the truth that we are not made for this world, as Christ clearly shows us in his Transfiguration. He reveals himself in his heavenly glory, just before he is going to be deprived of all earthly needs and wants — even his very life. He shows us that this is what we were meant for. This is what we are striving for.

Lent exists to remind us that we are not made for this world. When you become spiritually hangry — or as Scripture more eloquently puts it this week, when your mind is “occupied with earthly things” — turn your thoughts to the Transfiguration. I promise you, it's even better than grabbing an energy bar.

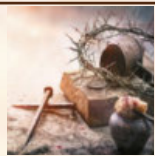
Our Parish Reconciliation Services will be as follows :

There will be several priests available to hear confession in English, Spanish, Vietnamese, and Filipino.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is the most natural way to celebrate God's forgiveness and love.



Lent is a time to grow spiritually through penitential practices: self-denial, almsgiving, and through works of kindness and compassion.

Fasting is obligatory for all who have completed their 18th year until the beginning of their 60th year. Fasting allows a person to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may be taken, not to equal one full meal. Abstinence (from meat) is obligatory for all who have completed their 14th year of age. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the “paschal fast” to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare to share more fully and celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

Fridays in Lent are obligatory days of abstinence (from meat) for all who have completed their 14th year. As always, anyone for whom fasting or abstinence would pose a health risk is excused.

RCIA - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:

On the *Second Sunday of Lent*, they are anointed with the *Oil of Catechumens, one of the oils blessed by the Bishop at the Chrism Mass.*

On the *Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent*, parishes celebrate the "scrutinies" of the Elect. The Elect come before God and scrutinize their lives in light of the Gospel. The Elect are prayed for that **"they may reject everything in their lives that is contrary to Christ."**

16 de marzo de 2025 - 2º Domingo de Cuaresma

¿Dónde está la presencia cercana y misteriosa de Dios en mi vida? ¿Dónde palpo esa relación de Jesús amigo cercano a mí? Estas preguntas nos pueden ayudar a comprender el misterio de la Transfiguración de este segundo Domingo de Cuaresma. Pedro, Santiago y Juan fueron testigos oculares de una presencia de Dios diferente a la que vivían todos los días con Jesús. De alguna manera, con esta experiencia se abren sus ojos y reconocen que con Jesús está presente el mismo Dios. Es por eso, que, Pedro desea quedarse para siempre en ese lugar: *“Maestro, ¡qué bueno que estemos aquí! Levantemos tres chozas: una para ti, otra para Moisés y otra para Elías. Pero no sabía lo que decía”* (Lucas 9:33).

Hoy es un día para abrir los ojos y dimensionar la grandeza de este gran evento en la vida de los discípulos, y también, en la vida nuestra. Jesús se transfigura para ellos en el monte y para nosotros se transfigura en cada Eucaristía, donde el pan se transforma en el Cuerpo de Jesús y el vino en su Sangre. Sin embargo, sin los ojos de la fe, no nos daremos cuenta de la presencia real de Cristo entre nosotros. Las lecturas del Domingo 16 de Marzo

Domingo: Gn 15, 5-12. 17-18/Sal 26, 1. 7-8. 8-9. 13-14/Flp 3, 17—4, 1 o 3, 20—4, 1/Lc 9, 28-36

La Cuaresma es una temporada de 40 días de oración, ayuno y limosna que **comienza el Miércoles de Ceniza y termina al atardecer del Jueves Santo**. Es un período de preparación para celebrar la Resurrección del Señor en Pascua. Durante la Cuaresma, buscamos al Señor en oración leyendo la Sagrada Escritura. El ayuno y la abstinencia son para adultos entre 18 y 59 años. La abstinencia (no comer carne) es obligatoria a partir de los 14 años. A los 18 años también se requiere el ayuno. Las excepciones son las personas con mala salud y aquellos cuyo trabajo requiere 3 comidas completas.

CHÚA NHẬT II

Lc 9:28-36

HIỆN DUNG GIỮA ĐỜI THƯỜNG

Suy niệm: Kinh nghiệm về cuộc hiện dung của Chúa Giê-su không dành cho mọi người. Ba môn đệ yêu dấu của Ngài cũng đã “choáng” trước kinh nghiệm đó: họ tưởng rằng vinh quang choáng ngợp ấy chỉ xảy ra trên đỉnh núi cách xa cõi đời ô trọc ở dưới kia. Khi “lôi” các ông trở lại với thực tại đời thường Chúa Giê-su mạc khải cho các ông biết hai điều: 1. Vinh quang của một vị Thiên Chúa được ấn dấu trong con người Giê-su Na-gia-rét sống cuộc đời bình dị như mọi người; 2. Mẫu nhiệm ấy chỉ có thể tỏ hiện khi bức màn che khuất vinh quang đó bị xé tung, nghĩa là khi con người Giê-su ấy phải chịu tan nát tâm thân trên thập giá để rồi ngày thứ ba sống lại.

Mời Bạn: Những ai đi xa Việt Nam một thời gian ngắn thôi khi trở về cũng đều kinh ngạc về sự phát triển rầm rộ và nhanh chóng của đất nước. Thế nhưng, cùng với sự biến đổi đó, cũng lộ diện lối sống hưởng thụ ích kỷ, con đề của nảo trạng duy vật thực dụng. Thách đố cho người Ki-tô hữu ngày nay trong việc thánh hóa trần gian chính là biến đổi mình bằng thập giá của Đức Ki-tô để cho vinh quang Thiên Chúa được tỏ hiện ngay giữa đời thường này.

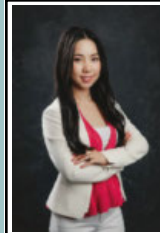

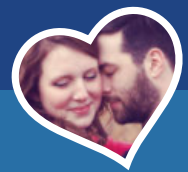
