

March 01, 2026 - 2nd Sunday in Lent
Sunday's Readings: Genesis 12:1-4a; Ps 33:4-5, 18-19, 20, 22;
2 Tm 1:8b-10; Matthew 17:1-9

Gospel Reflection : *When I sit down to answer emails or write a Gospel reflection or return a phone call, I sometimes wonder: Does any of this humdrum work matter? Maybe you ask the same thing about your daily labor. Today's Gospel, the Transfiguration, offers a surprising answer. Jesus leads Peter, James, and John up a mountain. There, "his face shone like the sun and his clothes become white as light" (Matthew 17:2). That detail regarding his clothes is worth considering.*

We know Jesus' body is inseparably united to the divine nature. But his clothing? That's something made by human hands. It's an artifact. And yet it shines with the same uncreated light. What does this detail mean? The early Church noted that Adam and Eve's first act after the Fall was to make clothing. This clothing symbolizes all human labor that supports our dignity. In Jesus' glorified garments, we see not just the redemption of our body, but of human effort to protect and uplift human dignity.

Parents, your family is your work. Baristas, plumbers, nurses, accountants — your labor, your emails, your phone calls, your spreadsheets — can all become radiant when offered to God in love. The question isn't just do I believe in Jesus' glory, but do I believe he can share it with the work of my hands?

Lenten Challenge: *Identify the "artifact" you are making to uplift the dignity of others: your job, your home, your relationships. Consciously bring it to the Lord this Sunday at Mass. Offer it to share in His glory. It will begin to shine.*

Come spend some quiet, prayerful time with Jesus.




Lent is a time to grow spiritually through penitential practices: self-denial, almsgiving, and through works of kindness and compassion.

Fasting is obligatory for all who have completed their 18th year until the beginning of their 60th year. Fasting allows a person to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may be taken, not to equal one full meal. Abstinence (from meat) is obligatory for all who have completed their 14th year of age. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare to share more fully and celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

Fridays in Lent are obligatory days of abstinence (from meat) for all who have completed their 14th year. As always, anyone for whom fasting or abstinence would pose a health risk is excused.

Please do not bring flowers to the Church during the season of Lent

II Domingo de Cuaresma Mateo 17:1-9

La liturgia de hoy está llena de símbolos de gloria y majestad. Si estamos atentos, podremos descubrir el gran amor de Dios hacia su Hijo Jesús y también hacia nosotros, manifestado en su Transfiguración. La gloria futura se presenta en la nube como signo de la presencia de Dios, así como en los vestidos blancos y el rostro de Jesús resplandeciente como el sol. *“A la vista de ellos, su aspecto cambió completamente: su cara brillaba como el sol y su ropa se volvió blanca como la luz”* (Mateo 17:2). La muerte que Jesús había anunciado previamente a sus discípulos, la que iba a padecer, será transformada en gloria en la Pascua. Sin embargo, para llegar a esa Pascua hay que pasar por el camino del Calvario, hacia la cruz. Pedro propuso hacer tres tiendas; estaba tan bien allí, con sus compañeros y con Jesús. De repente, se escucha la voz del Padre que dice: *“Este es mi Hijo, el Amado; éste es mi Elegido, ¡escúchenlo!”* (Mateo 17:5).

Para ser verdaderos seguidores de Jesús, debemos desinstalarnos de nuestras comodidades y de nuestros caprichos. La Cuaresma, que apenas comienza, debe llevarnos a comprometernos con el bien común y con la justicia que tanto necesita la sociedad actual. La dura realidad que estamos viviendo debe ser también un camino para encontrar la luz y la voz de Dios que nos llama a despertar y actuar frente a las necesidades de los demás. También cabe la pregunta: ¿a quién estamos escuchando? ¿A quién, o a qué, le estamos haciendo caso? Recordemos que seguir al Maestro exige esfuerzo y entrega. Bajemos, pues, de lo alto del monte para caminar con Jesús en esta Cuaresma.



CHÚA NHẬT II-MÙA CHAY

Mt 17:1-9

VINH QUANG NÓI KẾT THẬP GIÁ

Suy niệm: Trên núi cao, ta cảm thấy tâm hồn thư thái, an bình, thanh thoát như chạm đến cõi thần linh. Trong Thánh Kinh, “núi cao” thường được dùng để diễn tả chôn Thiên Chúa ngự trị. Không lạ gì chính trên nơi núi cao, các môn đệ đã ngất ngây khi được thị kiến ánh vinh quang rực rỡ của Thầy mình: *Ngờ li bi: n đ i dung nhan chói l' i nh' m v' t trời, y phục lộng lẫy tinh tuyền như ánh sáng. Có thể nói hiển dung là hiển hiện sự kết hợp mật thiết giữa Chúa Giê-su với Chúa Cha. Trong sự kết hợp ấy, Người bộc lộ căn tính đích thực của mình: là “Con Một Chúa Cha, Ánh sáng bởi Ánh sáng, Thiên Chúa thật bởi Thiên Chúa thật.”* Chính trong tư cách ấy, Người vâng phục ý muốn Chúa Cha, tự nguyện đón nhận cái chết thập giá để cứu độ nhân loại. Nhờ đó vinh quang của ngày hiển dung xuyên qua con đường khổ nhục của thập giá và thành toàn trong vinh quang ngày Phục sinh.

Mời Ban: Việc Chúa hiển dung hôm nay báo trước “Đức Ki-tô sẽ phải chịu khổ hình rồi mới vào trong vinh quang của Người” (x. 
FRIDAY Lenten Meatless Meals


